To: All Retirees

Open Enrollment begins **October 3, 2022** and ends **October 28, 2022**. <u>There are no changes to the medical, dental or vision plan vendors.</u>

- Non-Medicare plans offered by Kaiser, Sutter Health Plus and Western Health Advantage remain unchanged with only slight increase in premiums (all three carriers increased rates by less than 5%).
- Kaiser Medicare medical plans had a modest reduction from their 2022 rates and the UHC Medical plan costs remain unchanged for 2023.
- For Non-Medicare retirees who live outside of the Sacramento area, your coverage in the nationwide PPO, provided by Anthem BlueCross PPO, remains unchanged and also had a slight decrease in cost.
- Effective January 1, 2023, the rates for Kaiser Permanente Multisite Plan (KPMP) are now specific to the individual region, the 2023 KPMP premiums start on page 28 of the 2023 Retiree Summary.

You are strongly encouraged to review the enclosed 2023 Retiree Summary for a thorough understanding of your benefits.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR 2023

- IF YOU TAKE NO ACTION, YOUR CURRENT COVERAGE WILL AUTOMATICALLY CONTINUE INTO 2023. YOU ONLY NEED TO COMPLETE FORMS IF YOU ARE MAKING CHANGES.
- If you wish to change medical plans, add or change dental or vision coverage, or add or drop dependents, you will need to complete the enclosed Retiree Open Enrollment Form.

2023 Highlights:

- Kaiser Permanente, Sutter Health Plus and Western Health Advantage continue to be available for non-Medicare coverage in both Traditional \$15 HMO co-pay plans and High Deductible HMO plans. The 2023 Non-Medicare Medical premiums start on page 21 of the 2023 Retiree Summary.
- o Deductible limits on the High Deductible Health plans have increased slightly to the new IRS minimum of \$1,500/\$3,000.
- Kaiser Permanente and UnitedHealthcare (UHC) continue to offer Medicare Advantage plans. The 2023 Medicare Medical premiums start on page 25 of the 2023 Retiree Summary.
- o We are still receiving a number of question about the January 1, 2022 dental plan change to Delta Dental. If you have elected dental benefits in retirement, your carrier is Delta Dental, and they do not issue dental cards. Simply provide your dentist's office with your social security number and the group number. Group number are as follows:

Retiree Medical Administrative Policy:

We've modified the Retiree Medical Administrative policy to including a number of provisions that were our practice, but were not included in the Policy. We have included the updated policy in this Open Enrollment package.

ALL CHANGES (effective 1/1/2023)

Enrollment forms for any changes you make are due in our office or post marked by October 28, 2022 by 5:00 PM. If you are adding a dependent to coverage you must bring (or submit) required documentation (described in the Retiree Summary) to the Employee Benefits Office by November 4, 2022 by 5:00 PM. Your dependents will not be enrolled without proper documentation.

Virtual Open Enrollment Events

We had previously hoped that we would provide a single in-person Retiree Open Enrollment event. However, as a part of a commitment to everyone's health and welfare and social distancing, we have returned all of our Open Enrollment events to a virtual format, which can be found at: https://personnel.saccounty.gov/Benefits/Pages/Open-Enrollment.aspx.
